"Glider Instructor" CFI-G Scholarship

Purpose and Amount of the Scholarship

ESA awards this scholarship to provide financial assistance to club members for the process of acquiring their Certified Flight Instructor certificate Glider, hereafter referred to as CFIG-G. This scholarship is intended to promote and support the continuous pool of available glider instructors for ESA.

The scholarship may be awarded as often as deemed necessary by the officers. Recipients of this scholarship are eligible to re-apply if they can demonstrate serious effort has been made to complete the flight requirements outline for the commercial pilot glider certificate and/or CFIG.

The recipient receives a \$400 credit to be used for glider or tow fees with ESA. Funds may be used towards the commercial glider pilot certificate and/or CFIG. No monetary funds are paid out directly to the recipient and use of flight credit is tracked through our bookkeeping process on MyFBO. The scholarship credit must be used within 6 months before any unused funds become void. Scholarships are non-transferable.

Publicity of Program

The Glider Instructor Scholarship is advertised and promoted through the ESA newsletter as well as at least at one general meeting.

Eligibility

In order to be eligible for this scholarship, a candidate must be a current member of ESA. Members of ESA are not eligible for scholarships while serving as an officer. Members may receive this scholarship more than once and in conjunction with other scholarships offered by ESA.

The applicant must be in possession of a valid commercial glider pilot certificate and/or be eligible for this certificate at the time of application.

Applicants shall outline a training plan with their application how they will accomplish the required flight experience and time for the CFI-G certificate. Furthermore, the applicants shall submit a written commitment how they plan to give back to the ESA membership after completion of the certificate.

Application and Selection Process

Any ESA member may apply for this scholarship.

The application shall:

- Include a brief personal description
- Include a summary of relevant flight experience and certificates
- Submit a training plan how to accomplish the CFIG
- Submit a written commitment how to give back to the ESA membership after completion of the CFIG through this scholarship

Applications shall be sent by email or mail to the current ESA president and secretary. Applications must be received by midnight of the deadline date to be considered.

Selection Criteria

The selection is based on the level of involvement the candidate has with ESA and especially the glider division. Besides the participation level, other factors such as time as a member, fund raisers, volunteer duties, and other activities are considered.

The selection committee reserves the right to change the dollar amount and number of scholarships granted each year. The committee reserves the right not to issue the scholarship if the recommended candidates do not appear worthy of the award.
